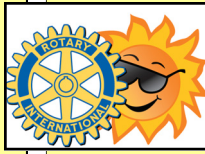

I would like to thank Hesham for sharing his experiences as an Ambassadorial Scholar. As you know, Ambassadorial Scholarships, are the Rotary Foundation's oldest and best-known program and was founded in 1947. Since then, more than 40,000 men and women from about 100 nations have studied abroad under its auspices. Today it is one of the world's largest privately funded international scholarships programs. Nearly 700 scholarships were awarded for study in 2009-10. Through grants totaling

approximately US\$16.2 million, recipients from about 70 countries studied in more than 80 nations.

The purpose of the Ambassadorial Scholarships program is to further international understanding and friendly relations among people of different countries and geographical areas. The program sponsors academic year scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students as well as for qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as goodwill ambassadors to the host country and give presentations about their homelands to Rotary clubs and other groups. Upon returning home, scholars share with Rotarians and others the experiences that led to a greater understanding of their host country.

Generous contributions from Rotarians worldwide represent a continued faith that today's Ambassadorial Scholars will be tomorrow's community and world leaders.

Eber, like so many of the Casa Hogar boys, would like to be a policeman when he grows up. He had been placed at a different orphanage but the director was able to get him transferred to Casa Hogar to be with his brother.

They both are so happy to be here.
