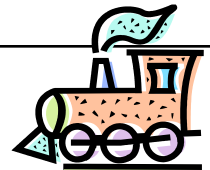

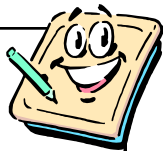

A note from Ann Nelson, Principal of BCHS ~ I would like to request a grant for \$400 to buy each teacher a flip chart of Master Instructional Strategies from Mentoring Minds.. The charts are \$10.00 each. I would give these to teachers during American Education Week in November. Thank you for considering my request. I hope all went well at WurstFest. I heard at a noon Rotary meeting that the event was successful. We appreciate your efforts to give our seniors a safe graduation party. (The board approved the donation. Mrs. Nelson gathered teachers and parents to help with WurstFest.)

Disaster Relief ~ Several from our club were wondering how we could help with disaster relief in Texas. Rotarian Terry Sain who is also a City Councilman in Baytown, Texas was our contact. Baytown is a community of 75,000 residents and is next to Houston where the eye of the storm passed over. The Rotary Club has about 100 members who have already raised \$5000.00 to help residents and the elderly within the community.

Doug Scheppmann said “the insurance industry is estimating damages in this region at around 4.2 billion dollars”. The board received a letter and after research decided to send a check for \$1,000 to the Rotary Club of Baytown for distribution.

The board approved \$250 for NAMI thru Cathleen Coon who spoke on the Partial Hospitalization Program which provides quality and intensive psychiatric treatment at Boulder City Hospital. The Adult partial hospital program meets the needs of people who are able to remain in the community but require additional emotional support. This intensive out-patient program provides a structured individualized program which focuses on specific needs.
