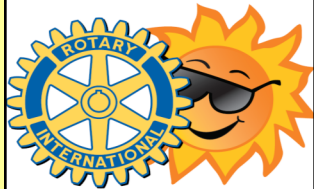

## News from our Roving Reporter, Donna Draney

Its not often that a person you randomly meet professes how Rotary changed their life, especially when they don't know you are a Rotarian. This darling young lady shared with all the passengers on the cruise I recently took around the islands of Japan her story and how Rotary changed her life.

At the introduction of the officers on this ship Kate Compton shared that she gave credit to Rotary for changing her life and setting her life path. While growing up in Anchorage, Alaska, she was part of a unique Japanese language immersion program. From first grade through graduation of high school, Kate spent nearly half her education spoken in Japanese with all native Japanese teachers.



After graduating high school, Kate joined the Rotary Youth Exchange Program and lived in a small farming community in northern Japan as a fifth year of high school. She experienced life in rural Japan by living with three host families and attended an all-girls high school for one year. Kate learned how to plant and harvest rice fields, dance in several festivals and play traditional Japanese instruments. During her year abroad Kate began the study of Japanese Tea Ceremony which she demonstrated for us and continues to study today.

During her third year of university Kate again traveled to Japan and spent one year studying at Japan Women's University in Tokyo. During summer vacation she spent two months traveling throughout Hokkaido while working for room and board at dairy farms

Kate is now an Exploration Leader on the Spirit of Oceanus, sharing the knowledge of Japan, its customs and culture with passengers. The stories she shared were wonderful and her knowledge of the Japanese culture really brought a colorful texture to our trip. It's great to see the end result of a Rotary Youth Exchange Program participant and once again see where funds to the Rotary Foundation touch the lives of people we will (most likely) never meet.
